## JESUS CHRIST,

#### KING OF THE UNIVERSE

John 18:36

"My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here."

The Sunday before Thanksgiving was the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.



#### **Annual Square Dance and Fund Raiser**

This was our 3<sup>rd</sup> Square Dance and already planning for next year. Our caller set the pace by again volunteering himself for being the caller next year.

I'd like to thank all that attended and those that volunteered for our 2021 Square Dance. It was a lot of fun and a great fundraiser for our two charities: The St Leo's Soup Kitchen, and the Malta Dental and Medical Clinic.

Last year in late summer the basement of St Leo's was badly damaged after the flood in Detroit and forced the relocation of these two charities. The Archdiocese of Detroit, Christian Charities ask them to join them in the Center for The Works of Mercy on Woodward just South of our Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

Malta Medical has since relocated and reopened. The Maltese Medical and Dental are now well established in their new facility. They have doctors and dentists volunteering from U of D Mercy and undergraduates from Wayne State volunteering for experience and service hours. In the last six months they have provided 603 visits to extract or fill teeth, and have completed 79 dentures.

St Leo Soup kitchen is in the process of relocating and hoping to open in January 2022. We toured the area being prepared for the soup kitchen; the dining room capacity for seating is 40 people at a time; much less than the previous 150 capacity. The plan to open with breakfast only in Dec/Jan period 1 to 2 days/week, with lunch to follow at a later date after cliental in the area develops.

We recently toured the new facility and were thanked by both of our charities for the \$2,550.00 net collected by our Knights of Columbus Square Dance fund raiser this year. We left excited and with a good feeling of soon getting started again.

Currently the St Lawrence Women's Group have allowed us 100 Giving Tree tags shared by both charities for this Christmas.

This is a great place and time for anyone interested in charitable giving this Christmas season.

#### **UPDATE YOUR BENEFICIARIES**

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things. Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
