## PERSECUTOR OF THE FIRST CHRISTIANS BECOMES EARLY CHURCH LEADER

January 25

In one of the most incredible and miraculous stories from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke the Evangelist reports that feared torturer of Christians, Saul, became what would be described as one like whom he was pursuing.

After receiving permission from the high priest to go outside of Jerusalem and find and arrest fleeing Christians, then bring them back to be jailed, Saul was subjected to a blinding light on his trip to Damascus. As instructed by the Lord, a blinded Saul was led to Damascus by his fellow travellers.

After three days, Saul could see after a visit with Ananias, who the Lord instructed to go visit Saul. After this, Saul was baptized and began teaching that Jesus is the Son of God. Those that knew of Saul's diabolical past couldn't believe what they saw and heard.

Saul's new slate in life is typified by now being call Paul. He became an early missionary and leader of the Church. His leadership provided the means for Gentiles to become part of the Church.

If God can use a torturer of Christians to be a primary leader in His church, then each one of us can surely be used as leaders and missionaries in the Church as well. Our call is to seek salvation and justice for others and not be mediocre about our faith. We can do this in many different ways:




As the strong right arm of the church, Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to our future priests and religious at all stages of their formation.

generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church.


#### **Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel**





#### **UPDATE YOUR BENEFICIARIES**

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things. Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies. Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
