 June 3 – St. Charles Lwanga and companions – 19th century martyrs of Uganda. They belonged to the Society of Missionaries of Africa (White Fathers).

- June 9 St. Ephrem 4th century Syrian Doctor of the church.
- 3. June 11 St. Barnabas mentioned in New Testament.
- June 13 St. Anthony of Padua 13th century friend of St. Francis of Assisi. Considered one of the greatest preachers. Typically depicted with the infant Child Jesus. Doctor of the Church and Patron of lost articles (it works often).
- 5. June 21 St. Aloysius Gonzaga 16th century Jesuit, died at age 23.
- June 22 St. Thomas More 16th century layman and martyr. Opposed King Henry VIII's divorces. He was Lord Chancellor to the king.
- 7. June 24 St. John the Baptist cousin of Our Lord and son of Elizabeth and Zachariah – died at the hands of King Herod for condemning his marriage as unlawful.
- June 25 St. Peter the Rock on which the Catholic is built – succeeded by St. Linus (he may be the Linus mentioned in Scripture). St. Peter was crucified upside down.

Our supreme chaplain, Archbishop William Lori, of Baltimore, recently wrote an excellent article on the efficacy of praying the rosary. He encourages daily recitation of it.

YOUTH LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE (YLI) RECOGNITION

The goal of the YLI is to provide an opportunity for teens to explore their talents, interests and Gifts of the Holy Spirit through Leadership projects and to serving others. This program is open to all teens from 8th through 12th grades. This year we saw a substantial increase in the number of teens participating and completing projects.

On Wednesday, May 30, 2018, Donald Heydens and Joe Lograsso attended the St. Lawrence School Middle School Recognition ceremony. The Council recognized each of the sixteen teens with a commemorative medal and booklet that captured each of their projects. Below is a listing of each teen and their accomplishments. Overall, they provided over 350 leadership hours with their teams, collected over 3,000 items for those in need and raised a combined total of over \$10,000.00.

BROCK BARBIERI: Blooms for Berry Home – Brock's ambition was to help beautify the group home of where his Aunt and other residents live. He often visits his Aunt and was motivated to make it a better place for the residents and staff. Brock's team raised money by selling candy at school lunches and ran a TV raffle at the May K of C Breakfast. Those funds and his team provided the means of cleaning up the group home garden, expanding the garden and planting flowers.

WALTER DeCASAS: Free Throw Contest for Covenant House MI – Walter used hiss basketball prowess to put together a free throw contest for the teenage homeless shelter Covenant House MI. His team of over 14 friends and family rant the contest and raised funds through admission fees, refreshments and on-line donating, and at the same time bringing attention to the works and goals of Covenant House.

NELLA DeMARIA: *Care Bags for Cancer Patients* – Nella was inspired by her grandma's illness to create gift bags for sick patients at local hospitals. Her team collected over 400 items and created 77 care bags and 4 bins of candy and books, and delivered them to the hospitals.

NAOMI FONSEKA: Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries – Naomi put together a team to help with the donations from school, items designated by grade, from first aid items, to toiletries to canned foods. She was able to collect 3000 items and donate them, along with some money to the DRMM.

SAM GIULIANI: *Empty Bowl's Detroit* – Sam raised money with a bowl painting event that brought in 110 people from our community to paint and prepare bowls for a majority charity event. He led a team of friends and family to put on a simple dinner at the K of C Hall and paint the bowls.

JACKSON KALKOFEN: Art Road – Jack's interest in art and all things creative led him to want to support the Art Road organization, which provides supplies and teachers to four Detroit elementary schools that would otherwise not have art programs. Jack's team of over a dozen friends and family collected cans and bottles to provide funds that support Art Road. Jack was then able to visit and work with students at one of the schools.

RYAN LAWROSKI: Clothes Drive and Lunches for those in Need – Inspired by what he learned helping Nick Tessmer (see below), Ryan carried the torch further for Sister Judie, having a team of helpers run a raffle, collect clothing and run a hot dog stand to fundraise to feed and clothe the homeless in Detroit. He has made lunches for 75 people with his efforts and will continue to make meals throughout the summer.

STEPHEN MENARD: Comforting Kids with Stuffed Animals – Stephen came to the interview with an original idea to help kids in stressful situations. Thinking about kids that are displaced or experienced a fire at their house, Stephen collected 1300 stuffed animals to give to the fire department, who then in turn could provide the stuffed animals to

kids. Stephen's collection was so successful he was also able to donate items to local senior centers.

MARIA MURPHY: Detroit Swims Foundation – Funding swim lessons for kids in need. Maria's great interest is in swimming and caring for others led her to take up a project to provide swimming lessons. Maria led a team to run guessing jars games in school and at the K of C Breakfast in February, /She was able to fund swim lessons for five students.

MADY NIHRANZ: *Pops for Paws* – "*I Heart Dogs*" *Shelter* – Mady put a small team together to fundraise by selling tootsie pops at school during lunch. The money was used for the shelter to provide animal medical needs, blankets and toys.

GABRIELLA SPAGNUOLO: *Make A Wish Foundation* – Gabby put together a team of her friends to bak heart cookies at the family's bakery and sold them during the week of St. Valentine's Day. Her team was successful and had to go back multiple days to back more cookies, and allowed her to help the goals of the Make A Wish Foundation here in Michigan.

NICK TESSMER: *Sister Judie's Treasurers of the Street* – Nick raised money to then lead a team of friends to make lunches and take volunteers to the homeless people of Detroit with Sister Judie. Nick was able to make 200 lunches with his team and personally led his team with Sister Judie to the homeless neighborhood in Detroit.

SYDNEY TOBOLA: Food Packing for Agape Center Foodbank – Gathered friends and family to pack bags for the food bank at St. Clement of Rome.

BRETT VARGO: *Mentoring J'Marion* – Brett came to the interview with the idea of being a big brother to a younger boy from a poor family and being raised only by his grandmother. Brett's team put on a 50/50 raffle at the March K of C breakfast to raise funds to support J'Marion through various activities and help the boy's family by purchasing grocery gift cards. Through speaking at Mass, Brett also attracted the attention of many parishioners who donated tickets to sporting events, allowing he and his team to further provide positive and fun experiences for J'Marion.

WILL WEINGARTZ: Fun Day for Rising Stars Academy – Will gathered thirty volunteers to create an events filled with games and inclusion for the learning and physically impaired students at Rising Stars Academy. Will co-chaired this event with one of the students from Rising Stars and created teams that competed in the different outdoor and indoor games. Will concluded the day with lunch, a giant egg toss game, awards presentation, dancing and singing "YMCA."

ALEC VALDO: Michigan Humane Society – Alec was able to put his team together to collect bottles/cans in his neighborhood. Additionally at school, his team collected items such as pet food, blankets, towels, and pet toys. The items and money were donated to the Michigan Humane Society.
