2017 MI DRIVE RESULTS

This year's MI Drive proved ti be a real challenge due to the fact that we were unable to solicit funds from the streets in our community. Some of you may have noticed people from other councils collecting funds on the streets in neighboring communities. They were either granted access by their city councils or were in disregard of the current law as it stands; it is a state law but left to the individual communities to enforce.

It was through the generosity of the members of our council, the St. Lawrence parish and other groups in our community that we were able to achieve what seemed to be an impossible task, with a total of \$33,889 received. Through your support we were ablew to almost match the amount of funds that we collected from the streets last year. These funds will be distributed at our annual check distribution meeting in August.

It is our hope that we will once again to able to have access to the streets in our community in the future. There is legislation currently being considered in Lansing to amend the law that would allow recognized charities with proper insurance liabilities to once again have access to the streets for the purpose of soliciting funds. Please call your state Representatives and Senators and ask them to sup[ort House Bill #4160.




Brother Knights:


