Perhaps upon witnessing the Baptism of a first grandchild, you once again heard the threefold description in our call to holiness. After the Baptism comes the anointing with sacred chrism oil, wherein the priest or deacon prays these words:

As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.

This anointing is a stirring reminder of the sublime dignity conferred on us. We, too, must embrace these shared offices of priest, prophet, and king.

Baptism makes us members of the Body of Christ. ... "to be a holy priesthood" (1 Peter 2:5). By Baptism they share in the priesthood of Christ, in his prophetic and royal mission. They are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people ..." (1 Peter 2:9). Baptism gives a share in the common priesthood of all believers (CCC, 1267, 1268). Brothers, being made in the image of God allows us to be a Holy example for others.

## "GROW THE KINGDOM OF GOD IN JUST FIFTEEN MINUTES A DAY!"1

#### Luke 13:18-21

Jesus said, "What is the Kingdom of God like? To what can I compare it? It is like a mustard seed that a man took and planted in the garden. When it was fully grown, it became a large bush and 'the birds of the sky dwelt in its branches."

Again he said, "To what shall I compare the Kingdom of God? It is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch of dough was leavened."

Jesus uses these two parables to illustrate the miraculous potential for growth in the kingdom of God. They speak about the power and grace of God, especially his ability to do something far beyond what we would expect with even the smallest of seeds or the tiniest bit of yeast.

The same is true for us individually. Even with our smallest effort, God can do amazing things.

The same is true for our Council as we aim to grow in size and to continue to live out our mission of Charity. Our potential for growth is enormous through the wonderful examples that we have in outreach to our Parish, neighbors and community. It must start however with one essential trait: authentic Christianity in how we live our lives. We cannot be successful in the recruitment of other men if we ourselves do not provide the best versions of ourselves to those we




