

"SEPTEMBER IS LIFE INSURANCE AWARENESS MONTH"

Then on page 35 Mr. Kaufman goes on, ",,,he (Fr. McGilvney again) spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature....his emphasis in business was his pastoral concern for the social and financial security of the family.:"

Fr. McGilvney lived with the social and the financial insecurity of a desperate family, with the breadwinner suddenly taken, that had to be supported. He left the seminary to work and support his mother and siblings. He didn't want other Catholic families to find themselves in such a predicament. That, and uniting men of faith, was the impetus for establishing our Order. Everyone who joined in those first years was insured, that was part and parcel of being in the organization. Now every member has a choice and every member should know what we do, and how we do it. Here's the process I use when I meet with families:

- 1. Discover Identify and prioritize your financial goals.
- Gather Data Collect facts and figures based on your current situation.
- 3. Analyze Input data, run calculations, identify shortfalls.


An opportunity has opened up for you to place your ad in the monthly KnightLife paper.


