On August 4, 2024, our annual parish picnic was held at our picnic grounds with good weather and great friends. This picnic was the largest since I've been a Knight and there were over 350 people that attended the picnic. The food was great, especially the chicken and there was plenty of entertainment with bingo, cornhole, and adult functions. Many children were at the event and played in our playground. Special thanks go out to Jason Meyers and Doug Kuligowski for putting on the event and to Jim Adams for calling the bingo numbers. Thanks to all of the helpers who cooked and setup the event.

The MI Drive Picnic was a great success with fifteen various charities attending the picnic. These charities are the tip of the spear working with our more challenged brothers and sisters and are a true blessing to our community. Some of these representatives have worked decades in their various positions and continue to do God's work every day. This year we donated \$31,103.32 in various amounts to help with their missions.

Once again, Joe and Laura Lograsso held a Science Day at the picnic grounds with 45 young people attending the event. Thanks to the many Knights that attended the event helping with set up, cooking, teaching, and tear down. The event was well received by the youngsters with the highlight being the cola explosion at the end of the day. Thanks to all of the teachers who taught the children and a special thanks to SLEFI who funded the event.

Four of our Knights attended the Gasoline Alley Car Show in Utica on August 10th to supervise and control traffic in and around the car show. There were many beautiful cars and a nice sunny day to enjoy looking at them. The Lions Club provided free food to at least two of the brothers which was gratefully accepted. Thanks to all of our Knights that helped out with this program.

St. Lawrence Council sponsored twelve seminarians with checks of \$500.00 each for a total of \$6000.00 to help with their educational cost. This money is generated through the St. Lawrence Parish weekly mass collections for seminarians and from the Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) from the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council. We received many beautiful thank you notes from our seminarians and all of them were grateful for the help and are praying for us. The harvesters are few, but they are strong and such good men. Please keep all of them in your prayers.

The rehab house is finished and was put on the market on August 19th with hope for a quick sale. I want to thank Jim Bokshan for his leadership in rehabbing the house and all of the workers who participated in fixing the house. This was a great undertaking and many hours were dedicated to getting the work finished. This is a paid position working for the Knight's Corporation. Salary will be discussed at the interview. If anyone is interested in applying for the position, please contact Al Mulka at 313-580-3985.

September 8 - The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary



Blessed Solanus Casey - Fr. Gabriel Richard - Servant of God Fr. Walter Ciszek, SJ Servant of God Fr. John Hardon, SJ - Venerable Bishop Frederic Baraga

(Third of a five part series)

Servant of God Fr. Walter Ciszek, SJ

Fr. Walter Ciszek, SJ, was born in a Polish-American family in Shenandoah, Pa., in 1904. Aspiring to the priesthood at a young age, he left Pennsylvania for Orchard Lake to study at the Polish Seminary. Three years from ordination, Ciszek felt a call to join the Society of Jesus and left for the Jesuit provincial in the Bronx, before proceeding to the Jesuit novitiate in Poughkeepsie, N.Y., on Sept. 7, 1928.

With the rise of the Soviet Union and the Bolshevik persecution of the clergy, Pope Pius XI called upon young clergy and seminarians to go to Russia as missionaries. Fr. Ciszek smuggled himself throughout the USSR to preach the Gospel in secret, before the secret police arrested him and sent him to the Lubianka gulag in Siberia.

Fr. Ciszek's trials in the gulag are chronicled in his autobiography, With God in Russia, which describes the trials and tribulations Fr. Ciszek experienced at the hands of his Soviet captors.


On Oct. 12, 1963, Fr. Ciszek was brought to Moscow and placed in the care of the American consulate, which traded a captured Soviet spy for his release.

Upon his death on Dec. 8, 1984, petitions were made to declare his holiness. The Ruthenian-Catholic Eparchy of Passaic submitted his cause with the help of the Fr. Walter Ciszek Prayer League, before the Roman Catholic Diocese of Allentown, Pa., where Shenandoah is located, took over his cause along with the Jesuits.

John DeJak, president of Fr. Gabriel Richard High School in Ann Arbor and co-editor of With God in America, a collection of Fr. Ciszek's writings published after his death, said Fr. Ciszek's cause is currently being considered in Rome.

"The diocese sent to Rome a document declaring Fr. Ciszek's heroic virtue," DeJak said. "I think he is a model for every Catholic and is uniquely suited to this age. With a whole bunch of struggles in both the secular world and the Church, he was first and foremost a model of faith."
